You are a fourth-year student on Emergency rotation.

You are in the Emergency department and are asked to see Sree, a 6-monthold baby and his father Arjun. Arjun is concerned as Sree has recently been acting weird and has had some bloody stools.

TASK

You have a total of **7 minutes** to take a history.

This includes:

- History of presenting complaint
- Constitutional history
- Past medical history
- Medications history
- Social history
- Family history
- Focussed systems review

At the end of the allotted time, you will have **1 minute** to answer the examiner's questions.

You do **NOT** need to complete a physical examination.

PATIENT INSTRUCTIONS

Presenting complaint:

 Sree here has been a bit weird. He has been sick for a couple of days now. In the last 2 days he has had some stool that is reddish

History of presenting complaint:

- Sick for about 5 days
 - Has episodes every now and then where he cries out in pain... and kind of draws his legs up to his chest. This lasts about 15 minutes
 - o Has had some vomiting, nonbilious
 - o Seems quite tired and not himself
- No fevers
- No rashes

Developmental History

- Delivered at 37 weeks, no complications
- · Reaching all developmental milestones (able to roll
- · Vaccines up to date

Systems review:

- GIT
 - Still feeding
 - o Vomit is non-bilious
 - Stool is dark (like red currant jelly)
 - No loose stools
- Neuro
 - May ask about seizure hx due to leg movement, but this is not significant
 - No signs of seizure activity
- Other
 - Sleeping more then normal
 - No signs of dehydration as baby is still feeding well

Constitutional history:

- · Before illness, usually very healthy
- Normal nappies
- Weight hasn't changed too much
- Still feeding relatively well

Medications history:

Nil

Past medical history:

 Just had the cold/flu maybe once or twice, otherwise usually a relatively healthy baby

Social history:

- Mother is a nurse
- Father is a office worker
- No one smokes at home
- · Baby is well looked after in a caring family

Family history:

• Nil
